



DR. STEFAN EBNER

MEMBER OF THE BAVARIAN STATE PARLIAMENT

Stefan Ebner was born on June 20, 1980, in Degendorf, Germany. As a former scholarship holder, he has a longstanding connection to the Hanns Seidel Foundation and remains actively involved in its alumni association.

After completing his military service, he studied economics in Regensburg and Boulder, Colorado (USA), graduating with a degree equivalent to a Master's in

Economics (Diplom-Volkswirt). He subsequently conducted research at the Institute for Employment Research (IAB) in Nuremberg and worked as a research associate and lecturer at the University of Passau. Following the completion of his doctoral degree in 2012, he moved into the private sector, joining a start-up within the Maschmeyer Group as a sales and marketing manager, where he later became a board member and Chief Communications Officer.

Ebner has been actively involved in the Young Union (JU) since 1996, serving in various roles including local and district chairman as well as member of the national council. He joined the Christian Social Union (CSU) in 1997. Since 2015, he has been chairman of the CSU district association in Regen and has been a member of the CSU regional association of Lower Bavaria since 2001. In local politics, he has served as a district councillor since 2002 and was a city councillor in Viechtach from 2008 to 2014. In 2023, he was elected directly to the Bavarian State Parliament representing the Regen/Freyung-Grafenau constituency, where he serves on several committees.

Ebner has been and continues to be actively involved in numerous voluntary organizations, including the Reservists' Association, the Association for the Promotion of the Bavarian Language, an organization for sustainable mobility, Caritas, hunting and traditional costume associations, the Bavarian Forest Association, and the volunteer fire brigade in Viechtach. On July 29, 2026, Stefan Ebner was appointed Secretary General of the Hanns Seidel Foundation.

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
